With the present letter we wish to send the manuscript entitled *Polysemy in Italian Prepositions:* From data to theory for consideration of publication on Revista Signos. The manuscript investigates the polysemy of Italian prepositions, and connects this phenomenon to other lexical/semantic relations. The manuscript also offers evidence that Italian prepositions' polysemy (i.e. ability to cover multiple related senses) is related to their morphological complexity, and that some prepositions are monosemous, a fact that appears unexpected in most works on this topic. By shedding light on these data, the paper argues that certain lexical/semantic relations can be attested and studied across this category: hyponymy, colexification and partial synonymy ("overlap"). The paper presents experimental evidence based on a corpus study followed by an experimental (elicitation) task with native speakers. From these experimental results, we discuss a possible theoretical account based on the "Semantic Maps" framework, and show that the framework can partially predict the attested results. We conclude discussing the contribution of this work to ongoing research on polysemy, and sketching possible extensions of the study and theoretical proposal to other languages and related problems.
